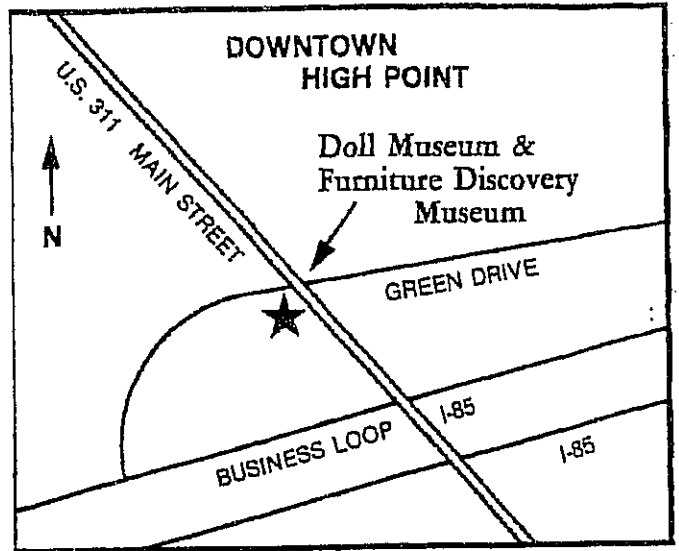

ANGELA PETERSON DOLL & MINIATURE MUSEUM PATCH REQUIREMENTS

Brownies should complete #1 and any other four requirements.

Juniors must complete eight requirements including #1 and any starred items.

Cadets and Seniors must complete ten activities, including #1 and any starred items.

- *1) Visit the Angela Peterson Doll & Miniature Museum in High Point, N.C.
- *2) Learn the background of the Museum's founder. What is her age? Where did she grow up? Tell something about her family; the house she lived in; when she started collecting dolls and doll houses; some of the countries she visited and lived in; what were some of her talents.
- 3) What different countries do the dolls in the Museum represent? Name at least 5 different countries represented. Are there any distinguishing features about the dolls made in specific countries? If so, what are they? What was the name of the founder's friend who gave her many of the foreign dolls?
- *4) How many dolls are represented in the Museum? There are at least 10 rooms in the museum. Name at least five of those rooms and some of the features in those rooms.
- 5) The "Crèche" is the only nativity scene of its type in the world. What is the meaning of the word, "Crèche"? When did crèches originate and by whom? What did these crèches celebrate? What location in the world did these crèche figures come from? Which parts of the body was particular emphasis placed on? Which figure is the oldest figure represented? How old or approximate age is the doll? Which figure or figures were the last for Mrs. Peterson to find? Where did she find them? What is the story behind these particular figures?
- 6) Find Mrs. Peterson's *first doll and second doll. Tell the story behind each of these dolls. What date is attributed to each doll? Tell at least 1 funny story behind Mrs. Peterson's first doll.
- 7) Find the Scarlett O'Hara dolls on display in the museum. Who was Scarlett O'Hara? What famous movie was she the leading actress? Who designed the Scarlett O'Hara dolls? Tell a little about his background.
- 8) What year did the original Barbie doll appear? Who created Barbie & Ken? What famous toy company did Barbie evolve from? Find the original outfit that Barbie wore. What was Barbie's original hair (color & style). Is a brunette Barbie usually worth more or less than a blonde version of Barbie?
- 9) Find the "Little Eva" doll. What period of history did Little Eva represent?

- 10) Find the Kewpee doll. What distinctive feature on the Kewpee doll differentiates it from other dolls?
- 11) Find the "Bye-Lo" baby doll located in the nursery. What other name is given to the "Bye-Lo" baby doll? Who was its creator? Tell or describe the life story of Grace Story Putnam. What American toy company is the Bye-Lo doll connected with?
- 12) Find the "Hilda" Kestner doll. What era did it represent? Describe its distinguishing features.

If visiting during the exhibit of the Mary Washington Heritage Collection of Black Dolls, the following questions apply:

- 13) Who won the Nobel Prize for Peace in 1964?
- 14) Who was the first woman in the United States of America to become a millionaire through her own efforts?
- 15) Who refused to give up her seat to a white passenger in Montgomery, Alabama in 1955?
- 16) Name the famous person who derived more than 300 products from the peanut alone.
- 17) Who was an advisor and official to President Franklin D. Roosevelt's administration?
- 18) This person led the "Underground Railroad", helping to free 300 slaves.
- 19) This person was an orator and champion of human rights.
- 20) Name the first black Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States.
- 21) This person was the first black to be elected to the Texas Senate since 1883.
- 22) This person was an early American Poet, author of "Poems of Various Subjects".
